THE IMPORTANCE OF READING

The English department welcomed parents to school inJune to discuss the school's reading drive. Falmouth School's new reading intervention program, called Reading Plus, was explained and demonstrated. Parents were able to see how their children are assessed and then supported if necessary. We also looked at other school reading initiatives such as form time reading.

Reading is important academically and for mental health and some of this research was explored.

For example, the National Literacy Trust has reported that 3 in 5 children and young people say that reading helps them relax.


Strategies for parents to encourage reluctant readers to pick up a book and several reading list recommendations were shared.









BOOK COVER COMPETITION
