Here you will find a vibrant tapestry that not only offers insight into daily school life but also celebrates the indomitable spirit of our mighty Falmouth Family.




GEOGRAPHY TRIP FOR Y11

Year 11 Geography students visited St Ives as part of their GCSE study. Students have put their theoretical skills to the test by undertaking two separate enquiries. Firstly, students enhanced their skills and knowledge of Physical Geography by conducting Beach Profiles, investigating wave measurements and Long Shore Drift.

This was followed by a study into the pedestrianisation of St Ives whereby students were able to conduct surveys on traffic, pedestrians and a land use survey before evaluating the impact pedestrianisation would have. All students excelled and modelled superb behaviour throughout, demonstrating clear enthusiasm for their subject and representing the school impeccably.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

At the start of every lesson at Falmouth School, students complete a retrieval based DO NOW task to reactivate their prior learning that was covered in the previous lesson, previous week, previous month or even previous term in some cases to ensure nothing is forgotten and learning is continually built upon. Teachers check students' understanding of this through using 'show me' boards.



CURRICULUM HIGHLIGHTS - ART

This term students are focussing on key techniques and skills:

Year 7 students are developing understanding of the visual elements as a foundation for creating Art. Year 8 students on the other hand have been exploring the art of other cultures to inform ideas for a 3D sculptural mask. Year 9 students are extending their techniques through exploration of still life informed by different art movements, developing their cultural and artistic knowledge. Year 10 have begun their GCSE course well exploring media and technical effects in portraiture whilst Year 11 have been refining their Identity paintings which they will extend further in a creative sculpture this term.

Year 13 s are working to complete their personal coursework and their creative process in preparation for their exam units.


