

Falmouth School Secures Spot in County Cup Final

Falmouth School's football team delivered a commanding 4-1 victory over Penair in the county cup semi-final. The match started with an early setback as Penair capitalised on a defensive lapse to take the lead within the first minute. However, Falmouth quickly regrouped, pressing forward and using their wingers to create attacking opportunities. It took time to settle, but just before half-time, a well-worked move between midfield and attack brought the equaliser, making it 1-1 at the break.



After half-time, Falmouth took control of the game, dominating possession and creating several chances. The midfield worked tirelessly to disrupt Penair's play, while the defence remained strong and disciplined. Their persistence paid off when a swift counter-attack put Falmouth ahead 2-1.

The final ten minutes were tense, with Penair pushing forward in search of an equaliser, coming close with a shot off the post and a goal-line scramble. But as they committed more players forward, Falmouth capitalised with two late goals, sealing a well-earned 4-1 victory.

Congratulations to the team! They now advance to the county cup final against Penrice on Wednesday, 30th April at Wadebridge Football Club. Best of luck!


KS3 Art Club









Yr9


Crafts Club – Creativity and Calm Every Tuesday




M&S Young Minds Competition




