### Year 9 Explore Conflict and Commemoration



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
This learning experience culminated in a whole-school VE Day commemoration. Year 9 researched the question, 'Who do we remember when we commemorate VE Day?' Their findings were presented on bunting, echoing the 1945 street celebrations, and shared during a special assembly.

It was inspiring to see the diverse people, groups, and events students chose to honour, reflecting their interests and deepening their understanding of the Second World War. This also gave them a meaningful chance to contribute to the school's collective remembrance.

This spring and summer, Year 9 students have immersed themselves in the study of conflict in Europe and the wider world during the midtwentieth century. A significant focus of their learning has been the Holocaust, building on the powerful and memorable encounter with Holocaust survivor Freddy Berdach and the thought-provoking assemblies on Holocaust Memorial Day.

Using resources from the Holocaust Education Trust, students explored the Holocaust in depth—tracing the roots of anti-Semitism in Europe and the escalation of Nazi persecution. Through discussion and debate, students examined the roles of perpetrators, bystanders, and resistors, developing a nuanced understanding of the events that unfolded between 1933 and 1945.

Beyond the Holocaust, Year 9 extended their learning to broader events of the Second World War. From investigating the causes of the conflict to analysing its key turning points, students examined diverse perspectives—considering the experiences of women and children on the home front, and the bravery of British soldiers and pilots in pivotal battles such as Dunkirk and the D-Day Landings.



# Student Spotlight: Harvey P

This half term, we are proud to shine the spotlight on Year 7 student Harvey. Since starting at Falmouth School, Harvey has made a smooth transition from primary school and recently achieved national success in Taekwondo.

Harvey's passion for Taekwondo began five years ago after watching The Karate Kid. Inspired, he joined the First Defence Black Belt School near Penmere Station—and has been hooked ever since! Demonstrating our core value of ambition, Harvey trains twice a week and often on Saturdays when tournaments are near.

Earlier this term, he competed at the EMAP Open Championships, a national event



attracting hundreds of competitors from across the country, where he fought his way to a silver medal.

We are incredibly proud of Harvey and wish him all the best for his future competitions.

# Manga Magic at After School Art Club

Falmouth School's after school art club recently took part in an exciting Manga workshop led by local artist Keith Sparrow.

Students were introduced to a range of Manga illustration techniques and had the chance to develop their own unique styles. As a special gift, Keith gave each student a copy of his illustrated comic based on the life of Richard Trevithick—a creative fusion of history and art.

We're also very grateful to Falmouth Library for funding the workshop and providing every student with a library card, giving them access to a fantastic online collection of Manga comics and stories.

### More Success for Our LEGO Robotics Teams!



For the second year running, our LEGO Robotics teams have been epic. One of our teams won a trophy for their Innovation Project at the regional FIRST LEGO League competition!

The FIRST LEGO League is a global STEM challenge that inspires students through hands-on learning in four key areas:

- Robot Game: Programming a LEGO robot to complete themed challenges
- Robot Design: engineering smart, efficient mechanical solutions
- Innovation Project: Researching and developing creative solutions to realworld problems
- Core Values: Demonstrating teamwork, inclusion, and perseverance

This year, four teams took on the challenge themed "Submerged", focusing on ocean-related problems. Two teams advanced to the regional finals at RNAS Culdrose, impressing judges with their technical knowledge, creativity, and presentation skills.







## **Innovation Projects That Made Waves**

Team 1 researched the decline of bull sharks off the Cornish coast, identifying noise pollution as a major threat.

Their innovative solution is a metal foam coral-shaped structure that absorbs underwater noise, provides habitat, and collects eDNA for research. They proposed using Autonomous Underwater Vehicles and sonobuoys to place and monitor these structures.



Team 2 focused on the declining lobster population caused by falling plankton levels. Their solution: a tidal-energy-powered drone that emits UV light to stimulate plankton growth. This idea showed creativity and strong environmental awareness.

Both teams consulted Royal Navy officers, marine scientists, and other experts, impressing judges with their professionalism and passion.

Learning Beyond the Competition

The teams also visited LEGOLAND, where they took part in engineering workshops and sensor training to prepare for next year's challenges.

LEGO Robotics Club will relaunch in September for Years 7–9. Next year's theme is "Unearthed", and we have exciting special guests lined up. If you're interested in joining or supporting as a mentor or expert, please contact Mrs Warden at jwarden@falmouthschool.net.




#### **KS3 Art Club**







### YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION ENTRIES

# Falmouth School's Year 7s Shine in County Cup Final Thriller

Falmouth School's Year 7 football team capped off a remarkable season with a courageous performance in the County Cup Final against Penrice Academy.

Played in scorching heat at Wadebridge Football Club, the final showcased the best of school football—skill, passion, and resilience. Falmouth started the match with energy and confidence, quickly taking a well-earned 1–0 lead, much to the delight of their travelling supporters.

Penrice Academy, however, responded strongly, scoring three times during a challenging spell that shifted the momentum of the match. Despite the setback, the Falmouth players refused to give up. With determination and grit, they battled through the intense conditions and were rewarded late in the second half with a second goal, making it 3–2 and setting up a dramatic finish.







As the final minutes ticked down, Falmouth pushed relentlessly for an equaliser. Though the goal didn't come, their effort and character left a lasting impression on everyone watching. From start to finish, the team gave everything.

## Growing SEND Expertise at Falmouth School

At Falmouth School, we are excited to be growing our expertise in supporting students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), ensuring that every child has the opportunity to thrive. Mrs Robin Penrose, our SENDCO, is currently seven months into her training for the new National Professional Qualification in Leading SEND (NPQ SEND). This course is designed to help SENDCOs lead inclusive provision and develop a culture where all students feel valued. Mrs Penrose reflected on her experience so far, saying, "It is so helpful to receive the most up-to-date best practice training and be at the forefront of new research."

Alongside her, Mrs Niky Riley, our SEND Manager, is nine months into her Autism Champion training. She is working closely with Mrs Julie Dear, who has already completed the programme. Together, they have created support groups for autistic students and hosted Autism Cafés, where parents can meet informally and share experiences.





Support for students with dyslexia and dyscalculia is growing, with Mrs Ruth Panszczyk working closely with Literacy Coordinator Louise Robinson on reading interventions and exam prep. One student said, "Understanding my dyslexic profile helps my teacher meet my needs... using a digital booklet with read aloud really helps."

Mrs Sharron Bryant is enhancing support for speech, language and ADHD needs, while Mrs Wing and Mrs Coles continue vital work around emotional wellbeing. As one student put it, "I feel safe being in school as I know I have adults who will look after me."

Mrs Sheridan Wilkinson and Mrs Tracey Whitehouse support students with complex physical and medical needs. A parent shared, "They've transformed my child's life beyond what I expected."
Our SEND team continues to strengthen Falmouth's inclusive, supportive culture.

### **Empowering Personal Development**

It's been a busy and rewarding time for personal development at Falmouth School, with students enthusiastically taking part in sessions that build essential life skills and promote responsible choices.

Year 9 and 10 recently took part in YZUP workshops focused on drug awareness, helping students make informed decisions and stay safe. These sessions built on powerful assemblies from The Naked Truth earlier this year, which raised awareness across all year groups about image sharing and the serious impact of sexting.

Next term, we look forward to welcoming Brook, who will deliver important sessions on healthy relationships—another key aspect of our ongoing commitment to equipping students with the tools to thrive beyond the classroom.







We're also celebrating the fantastic response to our new student leadership applications, which saw more than double the number of applicants compared to last year.

It's inspiring to see so many students keen to take on leadership roles and contribute positively to school life.


