Sporting Success This Term

This term in PE, students across all year groups have shown fantastic enthusiasm and commitment through a diverse range of physical activities, skill-development lessons, and sporting challenges.

At Key Stage 3, students have been developing their technical and tactical understanding through invasion games such as rugby, netball, and football. Lessons have focused on skill progression, teamwork, and applying tactics in competitive situations. Our Key Stage 4 students have taken their learning to a higher level, applying advanced performance skills while deepening their understanding of strategy, officiating, and leadership within team sports.

Beyond the classroom, our co-curricular PE programme has gone from strength to strength, with outstanding student achievements across football, rugby, and netball. In Design Technology, pupils rolled up their sleeves to create their own phone holders, exploring design ideas and bringing them to life using the laser cutter and 3D printers in our specialist workshops. The sense of pride as they saw their finished products was fantastic to witness.

The Art department was alive with colour and imagination, as students experimented with new materials and techniques, showcasing their creativity and enthusiasm for all things visual. Meanwhile, in Photography, students headed outdoors to explore how light shapes an image, learning to see the world through a photographer's eye and capturing some truly impressive shots.

Drama in the Spotlight

It's been a fantastic term in Drama, with students across all year groups showing amazing creativity, confidence and teamwork both on and off the stage.

Year 7 have been developing their core drama skills, learning how to create freeze frames, use narration and perform in role. They've also explored different theatre spaces including End-on, Traverse, Thrust and In-the-round to see how staging can completely change a performance. Using all these techniques, they've been busy devising their own short plays, full of imagination and fun.



Year 8 have been diving into the National Theatre's production of Frankenstein. They've explored the fascinating characters of Victor Frankenstein and the Creature, looking closely at emotion, power and responsibility. Working in pairs, students have been rehearing scripted scenes, showing real dedication and impressive acting skills.

Year 9 have been tackling a powerful topic called 'History of Events', using physical theatre to bring key historical moments to life. Through chair duets, stick work and handheld lights, they've explored events such as the Suffragette movement, the Gunpowder Plot and the Rosa Parks Bus Boycott, creating moving, original performances that blend history with creativity.

It's been wonderful to see students throw themselves into every challenge with energy and enthusiasm. The Drama Department is so proud of their progress, and we can't wait to see what exciting performances they create next.


Mixed Media Wonders in Wellbeing Club

They presented a cheque for £868.33, alongside student-designed colouring sheets and a wide range of colouring supplies, all created to bring a little extra joy to the children.







Year 7






Year 9






Our A-Level Art and Photography students had an absolutely inspiring day exploring the Falmouth art gallery and getting handson workshop experience.
