# Year 11 Leavers' Day & Prom: Celebrating a Milestone Year









Here's to a summer full of sunshine, fun, and maybe even a few number puzzles!






























#### **KS3 Art Curriculum**













#### Year 8





#### Year 9




#### **FALMOUTH ART GALLERY COLLABORATION**

# Music Spotlight: A Term of Creativity, Performance, and Celebration

As we wrap up another incredible year in the Music Department, we're proud to reflect on the creativity, growth, and talent shown by students across all year groups. From exploring world music to rocking out in bands and preparing for future coursework, it's been a term full of energy and achievement.

#### Year 8 – Exploring the Sounds of India

This term, Year 8 students delved into the rich traditions of Indian classical music. They experimented with rags (scales) and talas (rhythmic cycles), using authentic instrument sounds to bring their compositions to life.

Students showed real musical sensitivity while improvising melodies over different rags, crafting atmospheric pieces filled with cultural depth. Their enthusiasm and curiosity in learning about a musical tradition beyond their own was truly impressive.







#### Year 9 – Rocking the Class Bands

Year 9 ended the year with a bang through their Class Bands project; an exciting opportunity for students to work as musicians in self-formed groups. They selected songs that inspired them, created their own lead sheets, and rehearsed together with focus and creativity. The project developed their musical independence, teamwork, and confidence. This all came together in the final concert of the year, where several bands performed live. These sets were bursting with energy, and the collaborative spirit on stage made them a real highlight of the evening.

#### Year 10 - Ready for What's Next

Our Year 10 musicians have been looking ahead, completing skills audits and setting focused goals to guide their Year 11 coursework. This process has not only helped them grow as performers but also as reflective, independent musicians. Several Year 10 students also took to the stage at the end-of-year concert, impressing the audience with mature and engaging performances; a promising glimpse into the talent we'll see more of next year.

#### End-of-Year Charity Concert – Music with a Mission

The final concert of the year had extra meaning this time, thanks to the initiative of Year II student Mawgan, who organised the event in aid of Children with Cancer UK. It was an inspiring evening packed with musical variety; from dynamic student bands to elegant instrumental duets. Every performer brought something special, and thanks to the efforts of everyone involved, the event raised funds for a vital cause while celebrating the musical achievements of the year.

#### **Empowering Personal Development**

This summer term, Falmouth School has been fortunate to work in partnership with the Fashion and Textiles department at Falmouth University on a range of exciting sustainability-focused projects. As part of this collaboration, Year 9 students took part in a series of inspiring workshops exploring the environmental impact of the fashion industry and the importance of mending and reusing clothes. The first workshops were held at Falmouth School and led by university lecturers and students. These sessions introduced key ideas around sustainability in fashion and built directly on the work Year 9s have been doing in Geography, where they've been studying the effects of fast fashion on the planet. Students also learned practical skills such as basic stitching, empowering them to mend and repurpose their own clothing. Two weeks later, the students visited Falmouth University's state-of-the-art









Fashion and Textiles department. They heard presentations from local sustainable companies, including Finisterre, and explored how industry professionals are leading the way in eco-conscious design. The visit also included hands-on workshops, where students had the opportunity to upcycle old PE kit and experiment with professional-grade equipment.

It has been a hugely valuable and inspiring experience for all involved.
